Please Help Your Neighborhood During the Winter Season

If you have a fire hydrant in your yard, please help the Fire Department by clearing the snow 3' from the fire hydrant. Also, if there is a catch basin/storm drain in the road in front of your house, please keep it clear of leaves and debris so that the water drains off of the sidewalks and roadway and stops ice from forming.

FYI – Garden City Animal Rules and Restrictions

Number of Animals

No person residing in a residential area in the City of Garden City shall keep, harbor, or possess more than a total of three dogs and cats.

Ordinance #90.16

Animal Licenses

All dogs and cats within the City must be licensed, and the license must be displayed on the animal's collar at all times. *Ordinance #90.15* Animal Licenses can be obtained in-person at City Hall. The fees are \$10 per year for spayed / neutered animals and \$20 per year for non-spayed / neutered animals. You must present your Certificate of Rabies Vaccination from your veterinarian and proof of neuter / spay.

Snow Covered Sidewalks

Please remember that property owners are responsible for clearing the snow from the sidewalks in front of and on your property. You must clean the sidewalk within 24 hours after the snowfall. *Ordinance #94.48*




City power outages are due to falling tree branches – The normal is 20%. Please trim the trees on your property and keep new trees away from power lines.

The following roads (at the very least) will be repaired starting this spring/summer

Concrete Reconstruction

Gilman Avenue – Maplewood to Cambridge Maplewood Avenue – Hubbard to Merriman Sharon Drive – Maplewood to Elizabeth

- Complete removal and replacement of the street including driveway approaches
- Replacement and abandonment of existing water main
- Removal and replacement of storm water drainage facilities
- Sidewalk repairs and placement of new sidewalk where sidewalks do not exist
- Replacement or installation of handicap ramps to current ADA regulations



Asphalt Reconstruction/Reclamation

Bock Avenue – Cadillac to Hubbard Donnelly Avenue – Garden to Harrison Garden Avenue – Bock to John Hauk James Avenue – Hubbard to Moeller John Hauk Avenue – Farmington to Venoy Leona Avenue – Moeller to Merriman

- Pulverization of existing street and use existing material in base of new roadway
- Stabilize base with Portland Cement
- Placement of new asphalt roadway over stabilized base
- Removal and replacement of storm water drainage facilities
- Re-establishment of drainage ditches as necessary
- Sidewalk repairs and placement of new sidewalk where sidewalks do not exist
- Replacement or installation of handicap ramps to current ADA regulations



Concrete Sectioning/Patch Repairs

Alta Avenue – Radcliff to Farmington
Alvin Avenue – Venoy to Hubbard
Arcola Avenue – John Hauk to Ford
Beechwood Avenue – Brandt to Middlebelt
Belton Avenue – Bock to Ford
Harrison Avenue – Ford to Dawson
